

AN IMPORTANT NOTE ABOUT FIRE SAFETY

Last week, we held one of our twice annual fire drills. Arising out of that event is a concern we need to share with parents and students alike. We need to emphasize how very important it is that EVERYONE who enters and leaves the building at a time other than the regular arrival and dismissal times INFORMS THE OFFICE UPON ARRIVAL AND OR DEPARTURE. It is vital for the safety of our staff and our students, that everyone (including parent volunteers) participates in this essential process. For example, one of the protocols in a fire emergency is that assigned staff members check the classrooms, washrooms etc. to ensure that everyone has vacated the premises. If we are unaware of the presence or absence of a student, the life of student may be endangered as we may not expect them to be in the building. Conversely, a staff member may put their life in danger searching for a student who has left the premises without checking out. Even if the teacher is informed, it is necessary to check in and out at the office because that is where the master attendance list is held. We will be reminding the students of this important safety rule and we ask that you help us to enforce it with your participation.
