## SOME THOUGHTS ABOUT SCHOOL UNIFORMS, SPIRIT WEAR AND OUR 25<sup>TH</sup> ANNIVERSARY!

As we write the heading for this article, it's hard to believe that we will be celebrating 25 years of blessings here at FLCA during the 2019 – 2020 school year! We're already doing some planning along with our congregation at First Lutheran Church which will also be celebrating a milestone anniversary in 2020 ... 100 years of worshipping together and sharing the gospel with the Windsor community. We'll be sharing our plans with you over the coming months ... we're really looking forward to joining together with our school family, members of our congregation and our alumni to celebrate.

One of the components that has already been decided upon will be a new "Anniversary Logo" for our Spirit Wear in 2019 – 2020. We'll have the same Cross and Eagle as before, but in addition to our school name, we'll add some indication about this 25<sup>th</sup> Anniversary. **We're working with a new printing company to offer a school-wide Spirit Wear sale, beginning the first week of September, followed by an online component so that you can order Spirit Wear throughout the school years as you have need** (children do seem to have a habit of "growing out" of things!). You'll receive more information in our August Communiqué. As always, there is no obligation to purchase Spirit Wear; however, Spirit Wear items may be worn as part of the school uniform. Please note, clothing items with either our usual logo or our anniversary logo will be acceptable uniform selections for the life of the garment.

As many of our families will be shopping for uniform components over the summer break, we want to share our uniform policy now, before the summer comes. This may be especially helpful for parents of our upcoming Grade 1 students, who will begin to wear their uniforms every day, starting in September.

Please note, we have made a few changes to items that can be worn as part of the uniform, to better reflect availability and practice. Changes have been indicated in bold so that they are clear.

As always, we rely on our parents to closely adhere to the uniform policy, not wanting to single students out in the course of the school day. Please review the following list carefully; we hope that it will help with your summer shopping.

### Shirts

- Tops must be white **or navy blue** with no additional stripes or colours
- Tank tops or white "undershirts" are not allowed
- Sleeveless shirts may be worn in warm weather
- White and blue Spirit Wear shirts and t-shirts

**Sweaters & Sweatshirts**

- Sweaters and sweatshirts should be logo-free (with the exception of very small identifying marks) and solid navy blue or plain white (no stripes, etc.)
- Navy Blue FLCA Spirit Wear hoodies and jackets
- **Not necessary to wear white shirt underneath**

**Jumpers & Dresses**

- Girls may wear a plain blue jumper with a plain white shirt underneath
- Plain blue dresses are acceptable

**Skirts and Skorts**

- Girls may wear navy blue skirts or skorts
- Ensure that they are not "too short"

**Pants & Shorts**

- Tailored pants and shorts in solid navy blue are acceptable (no black or denim)
- **Athletic pants and shorts are acceptable; however, pants must be open at the bottom (no elastic)**
- Ensure that shorts are not "too short"
- Pants and shorts may not "ride low"
- **Leggings for girls are acceptable**

**Other**

- A variety of shoes are acceptable (running shoes, dress shoes, casual shoes, etc.)
- Sandals must have a "back" to avoid accidents outside.
- Hats may not be worn in school
- Extreme hairstyles and hair colour as well as earrings for boys depart from the image we are trying to promote
- With regard to make-up for girls, modesty is important
