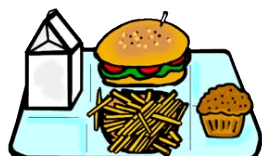

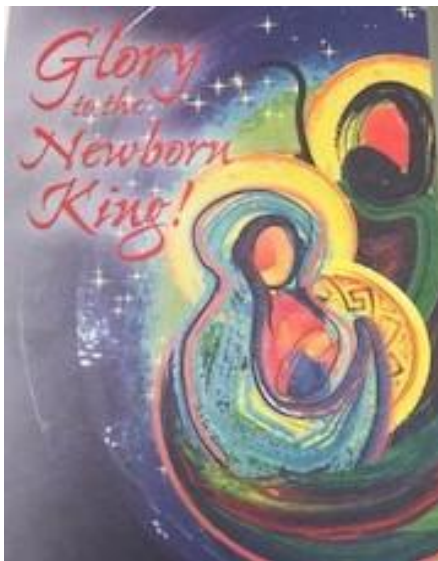
HOMework AND ABSENCES
